

# PVCC Courses Applicable to the MBC Common Curriculum 2011 - 2012

Although this list provides you with a great deal of valuable information about our program, you should be aware that changes in the common curriculum can be made with each new college catalogue. Once you have been accepted and oriented to our program and you and your faculty advisor have signed your degree plan, you will be “grandfathered” and these new changes should not affect you. Your Mary Baldwin faculty advisor will discuss your plans for a major with you, and, once you have been accepted into the program, will help you complete all of the necessary documents.

You may apply to our program at any time during the year. Once you have been accepted, you and your advisor will decide when it is appropriate for you to participate in orientation and officially enroll in our program. Orientation is held three times per year and consists of an afternoon session, typically held in August, December, and May of each year.

Note: If your goal is to complete the PVCC associate’s degree while working toward your baccalaureate degree with Mary Baldwin, you may still be accepted to our program and continue to work with both a Mary Baldwin faculty advisor and a PVCC counselor. As a general guideline, you should have completed at least two semesters of college-level work before applying to our program. **At any point one of our MBC faculty advisors will be happy to set up a meeting with you to do a detailed individual transcript analysis for you.**
