A national leader in personalized, transforming liberal education

- Ranked by *US News & World Report* as top tier-master's level southern university, in the top 21 among 117 colleges in its category
- Faculty: 76 full-time, 56 part-time; 97% of full-time hold doctoral degrees; 53% female
- Student/Faculty ratio: 9.5 to 1; average class size: 17.4
- Bachelor of arts and bachelor of science degrees in more than 30 majors in the arts, humanities, sciences, and social sciences
- Residential College for Women (RCW), plus co-ed graduate and adult degree programs
- Fall 2009 enrollment: 2,303 including 803 on-campus undergraduates in the RCW, 1,246 Adult Degree Program students, and 254 graduate students
- 2009-10 student body (Residential College for Women): 56% white, 42% American ethnic minorities; 2% international
- The only fully-endowed Health Care Administration program in the nation, plus pre-professional programs in law, medicine, ministry, ROTC
- Beautiful 54-acre campus in downtown Staunton, VA, (pop. 25,000) with a vibrant arts scene, Shakespeare theater, coffee shops, movies, and shopping within walking distance
- Churches of several Christian denominations plus a synagogue within walking distance
- In the heart of the beautiful Shenandoah Valley, with hiking and outdoors recreation in nearby Shenandoah National Park and George Washington National Forest; within 50 miles of 47,000 other college students
- Rich and varied on-campus student life with guaranteed on-campus housing, leadership opportunities in student government, student media, organizations and clubs, honor council, programming board, and multicultural activities
