9. Return to your List of Records for the search above. Find a title we don't own (those we do own have a small icon after the title) and look at the detailed record. Click on the button in the gray area that says Libraries or the link below the title that says Libraries worldwide that own item.

11. Do a Subject Search **using all the following terms**: *violence, aggression, films, videos*. Use truncation where appropriate to pick up plurals and variations of words and remember to put parenthesis around your related terms. **You may have to put more than one term on a line**. (3 points)

What did you type in?

How many hits or records did you get?

Look at the subject headings for several titles. List some headings you could search for additional, related titles.

12. Do a subject search on the Triangle Fire. (2 points)

How many books did you find?

Now, limit your results to **not juvenile** and **not fiction**. Look in the blue bar where it says limit results. How many books did you find?
